Fun Facts

- BGCNW was established in October 3, 1939. This year we celebrate our 85th anniversary.
- The original name for the club was the Boys Club of Mount Kisco, Inc. The name was not changed to the Boys 7 Girls Club of Northern Westchester until the mid 1980s
- Our longest standing board member, Stuart Marwell, President of Curtis Instruments, is a Club alumnus.
- Director of Programming, Athenia Lee is a Club alumnus who has been on staff since 2005. She began her career as a Camp Counselor.
- The Marlins Swim Team was originally called Dennis' Menaces after former Director of Aquatics, Dennis Munson. Though semiretired, Dennis continues to coach kids. He has been a part of the Club for 54 years!





Program Highlights

Early Childhood Education

In early summer, BGCNW partnered with the Office of Head Start to launch a Head Start preschool program at the Club. The Head Start program is free for eligible families, supporting preschool members through services centered around early learning and development, health, and family well-being. The program encourages engagement with parents, recognizing family participation throughout the program as key to strong child outcomes. We have also renewed our partnership with Bedford Central School District to provide spots at the Club for children enrolled in the Universal Pre-K program.

We began the school year with a total of 23 students in our new Head Start program and 6 UPK students, and 8 BGCNW ECE students. Twelve students will be rising Kindergarteners at the end of the school year. Each week, our preschoolers engage in literacy, math, science, music, nutrition, and social-emotional learning. In addition, they have twice-weekly swim lessons. Both of our Head Start classrooms are bilingual.







School Aged Afterschool Fun Club

We have 146 school-aged members registered in our afterschool Fun Club program. Each day, when the kids arrive, they are treated to a hot meal, lovingly made by our Ladle of Love family! After lunch, each group begins Power Hour - our educational enrichment period of the afternoon. Members receive help with homework or engage in math, reading, or literacy activities to reinforce what they are learning in school.

After Power Hour, groups rotate through our other enrichment activities, such as gym, art, Digi, healthy lifestyles, and more! Members also have the opportunity to sign up for 6 week swimming lessons.



Program Highlights

Teen Programs

In November, we restarted our partnership with F.L.O.W. (Financial Literacy Outreach Workshop), a teen run program from Horace Greeley High School, which provide programming to our members about the ins and outs of the stock market and how to invest money properly into different potential revenue streams. As part of our Workforce Development programming, we formed the BGCNW Junior Urban Planning Board, which will be a multi-year and multi-step program with a focus on sustainability. A group of teens from our Liberty Keystone Club volunteered at Temple Sharaay Tefila during the Westchester Youth Alliance's Thanksgiving Meal preparation event. Teens from all over Westchester County came together to prepare different aspects of Thanksgiving meals for over 150 families, including our Clubsqiving Feast at BGCNW. Keystone members also volunteered in setting up, serving and cleanup of the event. Keystone also begun discussing and planning what they will be doing for the annual Keystone National Project, the topic of which is Reaching Equity through our Diversity. We have 12 teens participating in the upcoming Youth of the Year competition. We will hold a semi-final on March 21st and the finals on March 26th.



Aquatics and Marlins Swim Team

Our Learn-to-Swim program has 220 registrants for the Winter I session, as well as 20 4th and 5th grade Fun Club members. We completed a lifeguard training course with 6 students who are now certified.

The swim team was awarded Bronze Medal Status in the USA Swimming Club Excellence Program for the 2022-2023 swim season for the second time in program history. We were one of 6 Metro teams to receive Club Excellence status. Other highlights and achievements since November include:

- The team hosted an invitational meet for athletes 14 & U the first weekend of December. The meet was 7 sessions with ~200 athletes / session. We had ~25 parent volunteers / session, and around 200+ spectators for each session. Team performance highlights included two team records in the 13-14 girls relays.
- Three Marlins attended the Winter Junior Nationals at Ohio State.
- ~50 13 & O athletes participated in a team travel meet by bus to the NCAP Christmas Invitational in St. Mary's College in Maryland. A number of new team records and qualifying times were established.
- ~30 11-14 YO athletes participated in team travel to Phx, AZ to attend a swim meet over the MLK holiday weekend. The team finished 9th/16 teams despite having few 11 & U athletes,
