DEMOGRAPHICS AND STATISTICS

- **78%** of the families live at or below the federal poverty level
- **72%** of Club members are English Language Learners
- **54%** are from single-parent households
- **86%** are eligible for free and reduced lunch
- **84** school-aged members attend Mount Kisco Elementary School, Title I Dual Language Bilingual Education School of Choice in the Bedford Central School District where **72%** of families are eligible for free and reduced lunch

- 86 years of serving the community
- Serving youth from over 35 municipalities
- Conduct over 40 programs fostering academic success, character and leadership development, and healthy lifestyles
- 20,000 touchpoints via Club and community events
- For 16 consecutive years, 100% of our high-school seniors have graduated on time and gone on to University, Technical School or the Military. Many are the first in their family to attend college.
- 92% of members in 3rd -12th grades receive mostly A's & Bs.
- 100% of Preschool graduates are Kindergarten ready and water safe; 90% bilingual, entering Mount Kisco Elementary School - a Dual Language Bilingual Education School of Choice in the Bedford Central School District.
- 100% of kids engage in planned daily physical activities, including a coed travel soccer team.
- Annually, the Club provides over 140,000 nutritious meals and snacks, made onsite by our Ladle of Love team.
- Over 75,000 youth have learned to be water safe in our Learn-to-Swim classes.
- Our Wellness Center is the first CBO-based program in Westchester County to receive preventative mental health funding.
- Over the past 2 years, our onsite clinicians have led over 7,800 therapeutic sessions for members, families, and staff.
- Serving as a supervisory center for PhD and Master students to fulfill their field work requirements, we are developing a future workforce of social workers.
- 87% of Club kids give back to their communities as adults
- 85% of BGCNW staff are bilingual

The Wellness program celebrated its 2nd anniversary - two wonderful years of creating memories, inspiring youth, and fostering empathy and connection across the Club and community. The Wellness team has had over 150 counseling sessions and completed over 700 Wellness check-ins since July 1, 2025
